LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLE

1: Today is the second Sunday of Advent.

Advent is a time of waiting. We wait for God to send divine love and light into our dark world.

- 2: How does this happen?
- 1: God's light comes through Jesus, who became a human being just like you and me, so that he could show us the way back to God's divine love and light.
- 3: A reading from the prophet Malachi: "I the LORD All-Powerful, will send my messenger to prepare the way for me. Then suddenly the Lord you are looking for will appear in his temple. The messenger you desire is coming with my promise, and he is on his way."
- 1: We continue to wait for the coming of Jesus. Last Sunday, we began in the dark, then lit one candle. Today, on the second Sunday of Advent, we light two candles.

First and second candles are lit. While this is being done, the following is read:

2: Every week in Advent, we light another candle. Each candle that we light reminds us that the Light of the World will soon come to us in the human form of the baby Jesus.

The Way of the Lord is being prepared in our hearts. May every valley be filled, and every mountain and hill be made low. May the crooked paths be made straight and the rough ways smooth. When our Lord comes, may all of us then see the salvation of God. Amen.

Please follow the direction of the greeters as they invite rows to receive communion. Please maintain a single flow: gpproach via the main aisle and return via the side aisles. If you do not wish to receive communion, but someone else in your aisle wishes to pass by you, please exit your pew temporarily to allow them to pass at a safe distance. You are also welcome to approach the presider for a blessing only—this is traditionally indicated simply by crossing your hands over your chest as you approach.

One of the ministers will bring the Bread out into the garden to serve those worshipping outside.
